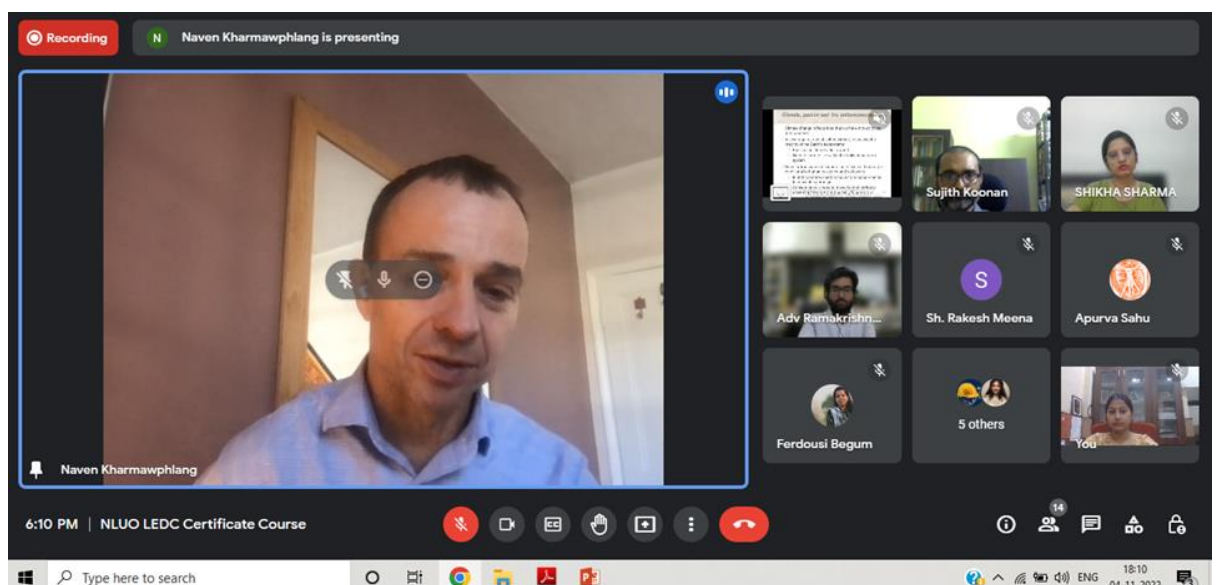

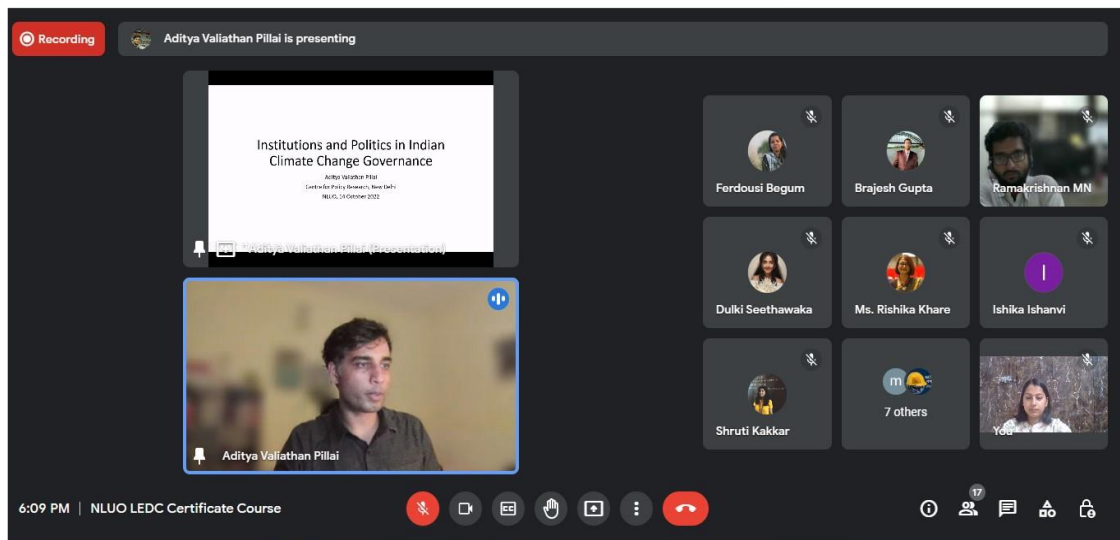

## Activities undertaken:

- **An online certificate course on Climate Change – Law, Justice and the Global South** was organised in online mode in association with Law, Environment and Development Centre (LEDC), SOAS University of London. The course was spanning over 8 weeks from September 2022 – November 2022 and was attended by over 35 participants from various backgrounds like legal practitioners, students, forest officials, public policy researchers, academicians etc. The resource persons were drawn from SOAS University of London, University of Birmingham, UK, South Asian University, New Delhi, Centre for Policy Research, New Delhi etc. Various sessions on Climate change litigation, climate and sustainable finance, just transitions in context of climate change were conducted.





- **CRAMON** hosted Season 2 Episode 2 of **'The Green Mandate'**, a platform for an **in-depth conversation** on such issues affecting current conservation challenges. It aims at developing a deeper public discourse on the law and policy aspects of it. A public conversation on **'Public Participation in Environmental Decision Making'** was organised on **18th April, 2023** as part of The Green Mandate in association with **Vidhi Centre for Legal Policy, New Delhi**. The guest speaker was Mr. Prafulla Samantara, environmental activist, recipient of the Green Nobel Prize and president of Lok Shakti Abhiyan, a People's Forum which campaigns for sustainable development, the right to livelihood, and protection and conservation of natural resources against unmindful industrialization. The conversation was attended by over 85 attendees who engaged in rounds of debate, discussions and questions.
