



Activities undertaken:

• A single credit course on Climate Change – Law, Justice and the Global South was organised in online mode in association with Law, Environment and Development Centre (LEDC), SOAS University of London. The course was spanning over several weeks from February 2024 - April 2024 and was attended by over 30 participants from various backgrounds like legal practitioners, students, public policy researchers, Government officials, academicians etc. The resource persons were drawn from SOAS University of London, Warwick Law School, UK, School of Law, George Washington University, Centre for Policy Research, New Delhi etc. Various sessions on climate change litigation, loss and damage mechanism, just transitions in context of climate change were conducted.





- A single credit course on Adjudication of Housing and Land Rights was conducted in collaboration with Housing and Land Rights Network (HLRN), New Delhi. The course was spanning over several weeks from February 2024 April 2024. Various sessions on human rights to adequate housing, land acquisition law from a human rights perspective were conducted by eminent experts like Dr. Usha Ramnathan, Ms. Enakshi Ganguly etc.
- A research project on the topic A research project titled 'Climate Change
 Education in Law School Curriculum: A Study of National Law Schools in
 India' was undertaken by the Research Centre under the NLUO Seed Funding
 Policy. The project aims at undertaking as assessment of whether an integrated
 approach is being adopted while imparting knowledge on climate change in
 the law school curriculum.
