NLUO (PROCTORIAL BOARD SUPPLEMENTARY) RULES, 2024

1. Short Title, Application and Commencement

- 1. These rules shall be called the NLUO (Proctorial Board Supplementary) Rules, 2024.
- 2. These rules shall be in effect along with the existing National Law University Odisha (Proctorial Board) Rules 2024 notified on 07.03.2024.
- 3. These rules shall apply to the day-scholar students of National Law University Odisha.
- 4. These rules shall come into force from the date of notification.

2. Definition

 "Day-scholar Student" means and includes a student enrolled in any full-time or parttime course offered by the University, but not availing the residential facilities provided by the University whether on campus including hostels, guest rooms or any other arrangement, or outside the campus in University occupied or authorized residential buildings.

3. Campus Timings and Necessary Permissions

- 1. Day-scholars can enter the university on opening of its main-gate at 5:00 AM every day, and they shall exit the university campus no later than 8:00 P.M.
- 2. In case a day-scholar student has to stay back on campus beyond 8:00 P.M., for reasons such as but not limited to preparation for moot, preparation for debates, examinations or for any other university hosted event or event where they are representing the university, the concerned student shall take prior permission as per the following procedure:



3. If necessary, the University may provide transport service for day-scholar students who stay beyond the abovementioned time based on circumstances.

4. The route map and drop off points for the transport service shall be notified from time to time by the Transport Officer of the university.

4. Violation and Penalties

- Any violation of the above rules shall be dealt with as per procedure laid down in and penalties imposed under the National Law University Odisha (Proctorial Board) Rules 2024.
- 2. Maximum prescribed penalty/fine for the said violation shall be as follows:
 - a. 1st time: Fine of Rs.1,000/-
 - b. 2nd violation: Fine of Rs. 2,000/-
 - c. 3rd violation: Fine of Rs. 4,000/-
 - d. For any subsequent violation, punishment/penalty shall be imposed by the Proctorial Board on the basis of facts and circumstances of the case
