Dear All

While you have the right to protest you have shown completely irresponsible behaviour by choosing to go on protest knowingly that members of wider community will be visiting the University.

By choosing to go on protest at this point clearly shows that you are not concerned with the reputation of the University and your own future prospects and careers.

None of your demands can be met at 24 hours notice.

Instead of responding to my one question about the legal provision which empowers the Vice Chancellor to stay a decision of the Statutory Authority, you have decided to go on strike is a clear indication that you are putting pressure on the University to do something beyond the law.

You could have chosen to appeal to authorities higher than the VC but you seem to believe in pressure tactic rather than reason. As lawyers, or prospective legal professionals, the least that is expected of you is your power of persuasion rather than power of numbers.
