Overview

Event Details

The 3rd NLUO-CLS Essay Writing Competition invites participation from all students of law in the form of essays containing deliberations over various topics of contemporary relevance.

Mode

The competition shall be conducted in **Online** mode.

Eligibility

- Students pursuing Five-Year/Three-Year LLB Discipline
- Students pursuing One-Year/Two-Year LLM Discipline
- Students pursuing any other undergraduate or postgraduate law degree from any recognized university

Theme for the Essays

The theme for the event has been underlined below. Participants are encouraged to demonstrate their understanding of the same through short and succinct essays according to the submission guidelines. However, the participants shall note that the given sub-themes are completely indicative and *not* mandatory. Participants are free to write on any other topic falling within the ambit of the main theme.



Essay Theme

<u>Constitutional Rights: Citizenship</u> <u>Assurances and the Rights Beyond</u>

Citizenship is the legal status of membership to a state. This legal status carries with it rights and responsibilities. One's membership to a certain state determines the kind of life they would enjoy, including their political life and rights. The notion of citizenship has elevated people from subjects of the state to empowered participants of the polity. While some constitutions provide certain rights universally— to both citizens and so-called aliens, many other rights are exclusively reserved for citizens. However, disenfranchisement and apartheid are also often used as instruments of discrimination even amongst citizens. The question of rights of individuals are complicated further by the concept of international human rights, ongoing ethnic cleansing in various parts of the world and, the global refugee crisis.

Competition Guidelines

General

- Submissions shall be made in .doc/.docx format (Word 2007 or 2010 or 2013)·
- All submissions are to be made via google form provided. (Note: write your name and co-author's name as the filename. Example: John Davidson.docx or John Davidson, Jay David.docx)
- The google form that will be used for submission will ask for the following information. Please ensure that the same contact details are used for submission and within the submitted manuscript: Name, Email, Contact Number(s).
- No indication to the Author (s) identity should exist within the submitted manuscript. Such a breach will lead to outright rejection of the submission.
- Manuscript word limit: 1500-2500 (excluding endnotes and abstract)
- Abstract of 50-100 words (not inclusive within the total word count) must be at the top of the manuscript.
- Any uniform method of end-noting may be used.
- Submission date: on or before 15th November, 2025 10th November, 2025.
- Your essay should be error-free: grammar, spelling, punctuation etc.
 your paper must be original and plagiarism free. Use of AI is strictly prohibited.

Competition Guidelines

Formatting

• Font style: Times New Roman

• Size: 12

• Line spacing: 1.5

• All text should be justified.

Note:

Manuscripts not in conformity with these guidelines may be rejected at the sole discretion of the Editorial Board. The Editorial Board reserves the right to send the manuscripts back to the authors for any modification(s) at any stage, in the event of non-conformity with any of the submission guidelines. The Editorial Board may, in its absolute discretion, waive any of the above rules or amend the process. In case of any dispute or ambiguity, the decision of the Editorial Board shall be final and binding.

Process of Evaluation

- All the essays will go through a double-blind peer-review process
- The review shall be in two stages:
- Technical Review: The article shall be checked for plagiarism and AI-usage along with language and grammar.
- Content Review: Review on whether it fulfills criteria of contemporariness, relevance, novelty.
- It is recommended that authors visit the <u>CLS-NLUO Blog</u> to get a better understanding on the type of submissions that are approved by the Editorial Board.

Manuscripts not in conformity with these guidelines may be rejected at the sole discretion of the Editorial Board.

The Editorial Board reserves the right to send the manuscripts back to the authors for any modification(s) at any stage, in the event of nonconformity with any of the submission guidelines.

The Editorial Board may, in its absolute discretion, waive any of the above rules or amend the process. In case of any dispute or ambiguity, the decision of the Editorial Board shall be final and binding.

Manuscript Evaluation Criteria

1. Grammar and Language

• The language of the manuscript must be crisp and concise. A direct statement or argument would be preferred over an indirect one and minimum usage of passive voice is recommended. Author(s) must be familiar with the usage of a term used in the manuscript. The author(s) may be marked down for unnecessary repetition, long-winded sentences and irrelevant rhetoric.

2. Structure and Logical Coherence

• The manuscript must be logically sound and appropriate for the objective it seeks to achieve. Author(s) may be marked down for arguments based on incorrect premises or presumptions, the lack of a clear structure or the lack of a proper logical flow.

3. Contribution to Existing Literature

• If the topic of the manuscript is one which has been written about extensively in the past, the author(s) must consider what the contribution of the manuscript to the discussion is. Merely quoting and/or summarising precedents would be inadequate. On the other hand, writing in a more innovative manner and providing a novel explanation/interpretation of a concept would be appreciated.

Manuscript Evaluation Criteria

4. Contemporary Relevance

Manuscripts are expected to include recent developments on the topic. A manuscript is considered to possess contemporary relevance when it deals with trending societal issues and legal issues that have not been given the attention they deserve. The topic may also be one that has faded from public memory but has reemerged for some reason. The relevance of the particular topic should be highlighted by the author(s) in the introduction.

5. Referencing and Research

The manuscript must reflect substantial and not just superficial research. The author needs to be aware of what citation is required in the circumstances, when to cite (and when not to cite) and the relevance of that citation.

Process of Registration
