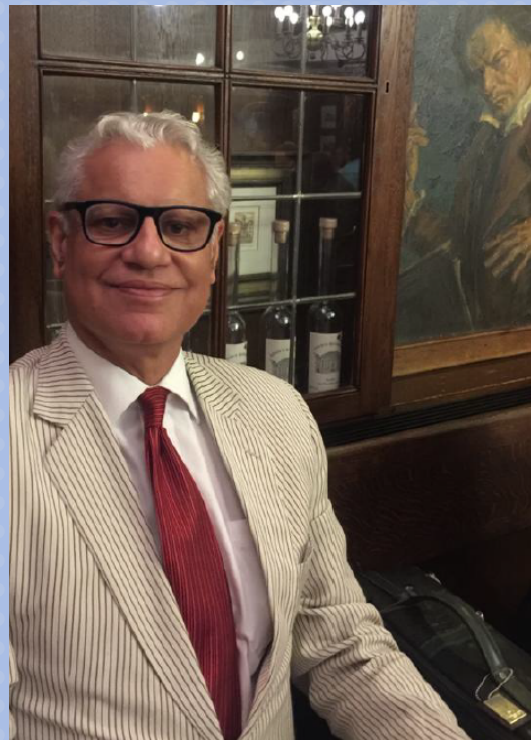

ABOUT THE COURSE:

- § The HIV/AIDS movement and Vulnerable groups,
- § The impact that TRIPS and IPR have on access to medicine,
- § The impact of other free trade agreements and ISDS on access to medicine,
- § The COVID-19 Pandemic and Responses to it.
